The franchisee (also known as a Business Coach) will operate a business that provides business coaching, executive coaching, mentoring and training to business owners primarily in the small to mid-market business sector. There are 2 franchise models that you may select from: (1) the "PRACTICE", our self-employed level 'Be the Coach' model, and (2) the "FIRM", our investor level 'Team-Builder' model.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of an ActionCOACH business coaching franchise ranges from \$81,773 to \$104,640 for a PRACTICE franchise and from \$125,773 to \$1,111,670 for a FIRM franchise. This includes the \$74,500 for the PRACTICE franchise and the \$99,500 to \$428,500 for a FIRM franchise that must be paid to the master licensee, franchisor or an affiliate.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the master licensee, the franchisor, or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**
