The Franchisee will own and operate an Al's Chicago's #1 Italian Beef Restaurant (which is also known as an "Al's Beef Restaurant", and an "Al's Bar-B-Q Restaurant") which offers for sale to the general public Italian beef sandwiches, Italian sausage sandwiches, hot dog sandwiches, fries, beverages, and related food products and items.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of an Al's Chicago's #1 Italian Beef Restaurant franchise is from \$392,800 to \$726,200. This includes \$30,000 that must be paid to the Franchisor as the initial franchise fee for a single store.

If the Franchisee wishes to develop multiple franchises within a certain geographic area and/or act as a Business Manager within that geographic area, the Franchisee will also pay the Franchisor an area development fee ranging from \$10,000 to \$300,000 depending upon the size and location of the development area and the number of Al's Chicago's #1 Italian Beef Restaurants to be developed.

This Franchise Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your Franchise Agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Franchise Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Franchise Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the Franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.

BEFORE YOU BUY, CONSIDER WHAT RIGHTS YOU HAVE TO RENEW YOUR FRANCHISE, IF ANY, AND WHAT TERMS YOU MIGHT HAVE TO ACCEPT IN ORDER TO RENEW.

**Special Risk Factors:** 

- 1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT REQUIRES YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY LITIGATION ONLY IN ILLINOIS. OUT-OF-STATE LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO LITIGATE WITH US IN ILLINOIS THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.
- 2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT STATES THAT ILLINOIS LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
