Another Broken Egg Cafe are distinctive, Cafe-style restaurants (a "Cafe") featuring specialty breakfast, brunch and lunch items

consisting of egg and omelet dishes, gourmet waffles, pancakes and French toast, salads, sandwiches, beverages and related menu items for eat-in and take-away service and, where practical, catering and/or home-delivery.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Another Broken Egg Cafe franchise is \$528,600 to \$1,210,500. This includes \$50,000 payable to the franchisor for your first Cafe or \$35,000 payable to the franchisor for any additional Cafe. If you enter into a Development Agreement for the establishment of two or more Cafes, you must pay to the franchisor \$50,000 as the initial franchise fee for the first Cafe and \$17,500 (50% of the initial franchise fee) for each additional Cafe.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and, if applicable, development agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.
