The name of the franchisor is Country Visions, Inc. (“COUNTRY VISIONS”). The franchise is for a retail specialty store selling, fashion apparel and accessories, bath and body products, gifts, wall decor and other merchandise. Your store will operate under the mark “APRICOT LANE.”

The total investment necessary to begin operation of your first COUNTRY VISIONS store is \$135,850 to \$341,800 for a start-up store. This includes \$34,500 to \$38,500 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliate. The total investment necessary to begin operation of your second and each subsequent COUNTRY VISIONS store is \$116,350 to \$322,300 for a start-up store. This includes \$15,000 to \$18,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliate.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

IT MAY ALSO COST MORE TO ARBITRATE AND LITIGATE WITH COUNTRY VISIONS IN CALIFORNIA THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.
2. THE FRANCHISEE'S SPOUSE MUST SIGN A GUARANTY MAKING SUCH SPOUSE JOINTLY AND SEVERALLY LIABLE FOR THE OBLIGATIONS UNDER THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT WHICH PLACES THE SPOUSE'S MARITAL AND PERSONAL ASSETS AT RISK IF YOUR FRANCHISE FAILS.
