The franchisee will operate a restaurant under the name Arby's and featuring a variety of Arby's deli-inspired sandwiches and complementary side items and desserts.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of an Arby's Restaurant franchise is from \$377,550 to \$1,961,200 for a Free Standing Arby's Restaurant and from \$320,550 to \$1,147,200 for a Non-Free Standing Arby's Restaurant. This includes \$6,250 to \$40,900 that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

- 1. THE LICENSE AGREEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT REQUIRE YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY LITIGATION ONLY IN GEORGIA. OUT OF STATE LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST MORE TO LITIGATE WITH US IN GEORGIA THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.
