The franchise offered is for a dog walking and petting sitting services company operating under the dog walking and petting sitting services company name that provides dog walking, pet sitting, inhome overnight pet sitting, and other pet related services.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Auntie Jo's Pet Sitting Franchise is \$39,410.00 to \$49,250.00. This includes \$25,000.00 that must be paid to the franchisor and/or its affiliate, as appropriate.

We offer to qualified individuals and companies a multi-unit development program which includes the right to own and operate multiple Auntie Jo's Pet Sitters franchises within a particular geographic area. If you enter into a Multi-Unit Development Agreement to develop at least three Auntie Jo's Pet Sitters franchises, when you sign the Multi-Unit Development Agreement you will pay a development fee equal to 100% of the initial franchise fee for the first Auntie Jo's Pet Sitters to be developed, plus 50% of the reduced initial franchise fee for each additional Auntie Jo's Pet Sitters to be developed under the Multi-Unit Development Agreement. The total investment under a Multi-Unit Development Agreement will vary depending on the number of Auntie Jo's Pet Sitters to be developed.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive the disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale.
