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### **BIG LEAGUE®**

The franchisee will own and manage a hair cutting establishment.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a BIG LEAGUE® franchise under a single franchise agreement is from \$116,000 to \$199,150 per unit. The total investment necessary to begin operation of the first BIG LEAGUE® franchise salon under the smallest area development agreement for two salons is from \$121,000 to \$204,150 per unit. These numbers include the \$79,100 to \$106,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like an attorney or an accountant.
