We offer qualified individuals and entities a franchise for the right to independently own and operate a distinctive retail hair care outlet that operates under the BISHOPS mark and features haircutting, coloring and barbering services provided to clients by a staff of trained, licensed professionals (each, a "Store") We also offer qualified parties the right to own and operate multiple Stores within a development area that we designate

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a single Store ranges from \$153,500 to \$239,000. This includes \$49,500 that must be paid to us or our affiliates.

The total investment necessary to operate multiple Stores under our form of area development agreement depends on the number of franchises we grant you the right to open. The total investment necessary to enter into a development agreement for the right to develop three (3) Stores is \$229,000 to \$314,500, which includes a \$125,000 development fee that is paid to us and your total investment to begin operation of your initial Store.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.
