The estimated total investment necessary to begin operation of a Bonanza® Steak & BBQ single-unit franchised business location ranges from \$241,202 to \$1,664,410. This includes the Initial Fee of \$40,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliate. If you enter into a Multi-Unit Development Agreement (“MUDA”), the Exclusive Territory Fee may range from \$40,000 to \$122,000 to develop two to ten Restaurants. The total investment necessary under a Multi-Unit Development Agreement to operate 2-10 restaurants within an Exclusive Territory is \$281,202 to \$1,786,410. This includes an Exclusive Territory fee of \$40,000 to \$122,000, and the Initial Franchise fee of \$20,000 for the first restaurant.

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

Registration of this franchise by a state does not mean that the state recommends it or has verified the information in this Disclosure Document.
