The franchise offered is for the operation of a rent-to-own (also referred to as lease purchase) home furnishings, electronics and appliances business under the name "BUDDY'S HOME FURNISHINGS"

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a BUDDY'S HOME FURNISHINGS retail business is \$385,166 to \$912,594. This includes \$100,860 to \$243,510 that must be paid to us or an affiliate. We also offer a conversion program for existing BUDDY'S HOME FURNISHINGS licensees. There is no investment required for conversions.

If you enter into a Development Agreement, your investment to begin operation of your first BUDDY'S HOME FURNISHINGS retail business will be as described above (minus the initial franchise fee for the first BUDDY'S HOME FURNISHINGS retail business that will be paid as part of the development fee under the Development Agreement) and you will pay us a development fee due in connection with signing the Development Agreement. The development fee will be \$25,000 for your first BUDDY'S HOME FURNISHINGS retail business to be developed under the Development Agreement and 40% of the initial franchise fee for each additional BUDDY'S HOME FURNISHINGS retail business to be developed under the Development Agreement

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement, development agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, us or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale.
