A franchisee operating under our system will operate a French hair and beauty salon (a "Salon") using our marks (such as "Camille Albane" and "Camille Albane Paris").

The Initial Franchise Fee for a single Salon is \$40,000.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Camille Albane franchised business ranges from \$245,900 to \$424,800. This includes \$80,000116,650 to \$424,860172,800 that must be paid to us or our affiliates.

The Initial Franchise Fee for a single Salon is \$40,000. If you already operate one Salon when you enter into a Franchise Agreement, the Initial Franchise Fee for the second Salon will be reduced to \$30,000 (and your total invastment necessary to begin operation of that second Cemille Albane franchised business will range from \$235,900 to \$414,800). If you already operate two or more Salons when you enter into a Franchise Agreement, the Initial Franchise Fee for the third (and any additional) Salons will be reduced to \$20,000 (and your total investment necessary to begin operation of those Cemille Albane franchised businesses will range from \$225<u>245</u>,900 to \$404<u>424</u>,800).

We also offer to enter into Development Agreements with qualified parties who wish to establish an agreed-upon number of Salons in an agreed-upon area. The Development Fee is \$75,000 for three Salons and \$100,000 for five Salons. The Development Fee is paid to us when you sign the Development Agreement. The Development Fee is paid instead of the Initial Franchise Fees that would otherwise apply for those Salons. The seet to open each Salon is described in the paragraph above.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.
