Caribou Coffee Development Company, Inc. offers franchises for the operation of CARIBOU COFFEE® coffeehouses (“Coffeehouses”) that sell coffees, teas, baked goods, sandwiches, and other beverage and food products from kiosk style locations within a host facility, such as shopping malls, strip shopping centers, public transportation facilities, convention centers, grocery stores, university food courts, movie theaters, health clubs, hospitals and similar venues. The total investment necessary to begin operation of a typical kiosk style Coffeehouse is \$347,405 to \$560,495. This includes \$32,400 to \$41,300 that must be paid to us or our affiliates.

We also offer franchises for the operation of Coffeehouses located at a stand-alone location that are not dependent on a host facility for customer traffic. The total investment necessary to begin operation of a stand-alone Coffeehouse is \$530,165 to \$953,995. This includes \$36,400 to \$45,300 that must be paid to us or our affiliates.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your license (franchise) agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

2. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.

We use the services of one or more FRANCHISE BROKERS or referral sources to assist us in selling our franchise. A franchise broker or referral source represents us, not you.
