A Canng Transitions franchise organizes and conducts sales of estate assets, personal belongings, and household goods and provides transition services, liquidations, and moving management services for individuals, businesses, and organizations

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Caring Transitions franchise is from \$58,112 to \$85,812. This includes \$44,900 to \$49,900 that must be paid to the franchisor or an affiliate (depending on whether we finance a portion of the initial franchise fee).

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement or make any payment in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document**.
