The franchisee will operate a school (a “**Children’s Magnet Montessori Business**”) which is guided by the educational philosophy of Dr. Maria Montessori, and is dedicated to preparing children to excel in a global society by providing an academically rigorous, engaging and supportive learning environment that cultivates curiosity, creativity and critical thinking. The school will offer programs for children between six weeks and 12 years of age under the name Children’s Magnet Montessori School.

The estimated total initial investment necessary to begin operation of a Children’s Magnet Montessori Business franchise ranges from \$695,177 to \$3,498,650. This includes \$81,500 that you must pay to us before you open.

If you enter into an area development agreement, the development fee will be \$20,000 for each Children’s Magnet Montessori Business to be opened under that agreement.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

You may wish to receive your disclosure document in another format that is more convenient for you.
