The franchisee will operate a Complete Nutrition store, a retail store offering nutritional supplements, health and beauty products, and other related items to the general public.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Complete Nutrition franchise ranges from \$188,450 to \$406,250. This estimate includes a range of \$63,500 to \$80,250 that must be paid to the franchisor or an affiliate. You might pay us more if you sign a Development Rights Agreement for multi-unit development (see Item 5).

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**
