If you sign a franchise agreement, you will operate a Culver's® Restaurant offering burgers, sandwiches, salads, dinners, frozen custard desserts, beverages and other menu items in a quick-service setting. Certain existing Culver's® franchisees meeting our criteria also may enter into a multiple unit development agreement with us to develop multiple Culver's® Restaurants.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Culver's® Restaurant is from \$1,363,500439,000 to \$3,219,500087,000. This includes a \$30,000 to \$55,000 initial franchise fee that must be paid to us. If you sign a multiple unit development agreement, you must pay us a development fee of \$10,000 for each Restaurant you agree to develop under your Development Schedule.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.
