DL Franchising, LLC d/b/ Deka Lash ("Deka Lash") offers a franchise opportunity to operate studios which offer eyelash extension and related products and services.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Deka Lash franchise is \$179,251 - \$426,491. This includes \$72,529 - \$73,550 that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate. The total investment necessary to begin operation of an "Area Development Business" franchise for 2-10 outlets is \$210,251 to \$654,491. This includes \$103,539 - \$301,550 that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate. You may purchase additional franchises for \$25,000 each at the time of initial purchase.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

OUT-OF-STATE MEDIATION AND LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST MORE TO MEDIATE AND LITIGATE WITH US IN PENNSYLVANIA THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.

- 5. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THE FRANCHISE.
