The total investment necessary to being operation of a Floor-Tek franchise ranges from \$2,695 to \$37,685. This includes \$1,000 to \$10,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or an affiliate.

You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payments to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. The term of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, such as a lawyer or an accountant.

OUT-OF-STATE ARBITRATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES IF YOU DO NOT LIVE IN CALIFORNIA.
