The franchisee will operate a FlyFoe franchised business which provides mosquito and tick control services and other related services (“Franchised Business”).

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a FlyFoe Select Market Franchised Business is from \$72,940 to \$105,240, which includes \$17,000 to be paid to the franchisor. The total investment necessary to begin a FlyFoe Select Market Franchised Business if you are a qualified service veteran of the United States armed forces is \$69,940 to \$102,240, which includes \$14,000 that must be paid to the franchisor. The total investment necessary to begin a FlyFoe Select Market Conversion Franchised Business is \$64,440 to \$96,740, which includes \$8,500 to the franchisor.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a FlyFoe Enterprise Market Franchised Business is from \$89,940 to \$122,240 which includes \$34,000 to be paid to the franchisor. The total investment necessary to begin a FlyFoe Enterprise Market Franchised Business if you are a qualified service veteran of the United States armed forces is \$86,940 to \$119,240, which includes \$31,000 that must be paid to the franchisor. The total investment necessary to begin a FlyFoe Enterprise Market Conversion Franchised Business is \$72,940 to \$105,240, which includes \$17,000 to the franchisor.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a FlyFoe Multi-Unit Enterprise Market Franchised Business is from \$139,490 to \$178,490 which includes \$68,000 to be paid to the franchisor. The total investment necessary to begin a FlyFoe Multi-Unit Enterprise Market Franchised Business if you are a qualified service veteran of the United States armed forces is \$136,490 to \$175,490, which includes \$65,000 that must be paid to the franchisor
