The franchisee will operate a quick serve restaurant and catering and delivery business specializing in Mediterranean cuisine, including hummus, falafel, chicken and beef shwarmas and salads on handmade pita and laffa and soups and desserts under the trademark "Garbanzo Mediterranean Fresh".

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Garbanzo Mediterranean Fresh restaurant is \$384,875 to \$970,469. This includes the \$30,000 initial fees that must be paid to the franchisor. If you are granted area development rights under an Area Development Agreement, you will pay a Development Fee of \$30,000 for each proposed Garbanzo Mediterranean Fresh restaurant.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

- 1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT REQUIRES YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY LITIGATION OR ARBITRATION IN COLORADO. OUT OF STATE LITIGATION OR ARBITRATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO LITIGATE OR ARBITRATE WITH US IN COLORADO THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.
- 2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT STATES THAT COLORADO LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
- 3. THE FRANCHISE OWNERS AND THEIR SPOUSES MUST EACH SIGN PERSONAL GUARANTIES MAKING EACH SPOUSE JOINTLY AND SEVERALLY LIABLE FOR ALL OBLIGATIONS OF THE FRANCHISE. THESE GUARANTIES PLACE EACH FRANCHISE OWNER'S AND EACH SPOUSE'S PERSONAL ASSETS AT RISK.
- 4. THE FRANCHISEE IS NOT GRANTED AN EXCLUSIVE TERRITORY AND FRANCHISOR MAY COMPETE WITH FRANCHISEE IN NON-TRADITIONAL LOCATIONS.
- 5. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.

We may use the services of one or more Franchise Broker or referral sources to assist us in selling our franchise. A franchise broker or referral source represents us, not you. We pay this person a fee for selling our franchise or referring you to us. You should be sure to do your own investigation of the franchise.

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
