The franchise is for a Mongolian barbecue restaurant featuring "build-your-own-bowls" of stir-fry cuisine, signature alcoholic beverages and desserts and related items ("GENGHIS GRILL® Restaurant" or "Restaurant").

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a GENGHIS GRILL® Restaurant is \$\frac{320}{315},000 to \$\frac{643}{740},000. This amount includes \$\frac{50}{60},000 to \$\frac{5575}{5},000 for the initial franchise fee that must be paid to franchisor under a Development Agreement for the development of one Restaurant and for the custom grill, Initial Décor Package, and Interior Printables Package computer and point of sale system fees that must be paid to franchisor. If we grant you multi-unit development rights, you must pay us a development fee equal to \$30,000 for the first Restaurant to be developed, plus \$15,000 multiplied by each additional Restaurant to be developed.

This Franchise Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Franchise Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Franchise Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

- 1. THE FRANCHISE AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENTS PERMIT YOU TO MEDIATE ONLY IN DALLAS, TEXAS AND SUE US ONLY IN DALLAS COUNTY, TEXAS. OUT OF STATE MEDIATION AND LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST MORE TO MEDIATE IN DALLAS, TEXAS AND LITIGATE WITH US IN DALLAS COUNTY, TEXAS THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.
- 2. THE FRANCHISE AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENTS STATE THAT TEXAS LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENTS, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
