



## FRANCHISE DISCLOSURE DOCUMENT

GET A GRIP Franchising, LLC  
(a New Mexico limited liability company)  
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This franchise offering covers the right to operate a service business that restores, resurfaces and/or refinishes multiple surfaces, primarily bathtubs (porcelain and fiberglass) and countertops (laminated, cultured marble and tile). Repairs may also be made to fiberglass tubs and showers, and many other types of kitchen and bathroom surfaces. Our work is performed for residential, commercial and government properties.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a franchised service business is estimated to range between approximately \$43,600 and \$92,700, plus \$5,000 for each 100,000 in population over 1,000,000 in your Primary Marketing Area. This includes an amount between \$30,000 and \$60,000 that must be paid to us.

This franchise disclosure document (the “Disclosure Document”) summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information in this document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don’t rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

Buying a franchise is a complex investment. The information in this disclosure document can help you make up your mind. BEFORE YOU BUY, CONSIDER WHAT RIGHTS YOU HAVE TO RENEW YOUR FRANCHISE, IF ANY, AND WHAT TERMS YOU MIGHT HAVE TO ACCEPT IN ORDER TO RENEW.

Please consider the following RISK FACTORS before you buy this franchise:

1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT REQUIRES YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY LITIGATION ONLY IN BERNALILLO COUNTY, NEW MEXICO. OUT-OF-STATE LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO LITIGATE WITH US IN BERNALILLO COUNTY, NEW MEXICO THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.
2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT STATES THAT NEW MEXICO LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
3. THERE ARE FINANCIAL AND LEGAL RISKS TO MOST BUSINESS EFFORTS, INCLUDING THIS FRANCHISE. TAKE YOUR TIME TO DECIDE. YOU MAY FIND IT USEFUL TO REVIEW THIS FRANCHISE OFFERING, THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT, AND EXHIBITS WITH YOUR OWN ACCOUNTING, FINANCIAL AND LEGAL ADVISORS.
4. YOU MUST MEET MONTHLY PURCHASE REQUIREMENTS. FAILURE TO MEET THESE REQUIREMENTS MAY RESULT IN TERMINATION OF YOUR FRANCHISE, LOSS OF YOUR RIGHT TO RENEW THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT OR THE LOCATION OF ANOTHER FRANCHISE OR COMPANY OWNED SERVICE BUSINESS IN YOUR PRIMARY MARKETING AREA.

5. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.
