VPC Pizza Franchise, LLC (“**Franchisor**”) offers franchises to operate restaurants known as Giordano’s® Restaurants (“**Giordano’s® Restaurants**”). Giordano’s® Restaurants specialize in the sale of stuffed and thin-crust pizza, pasta, sandwiches, salads and other related food products prepared and sold in a manner and pursuant to specific recipes, formulas, techniques, methods of operation, procedures and standards.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Giordano’s® Restaurant franchise is between \$535,000 and \$765,000 for a Limited-Service Restaurant and between \$1,100,000 and \$1,775,000 for a Full-Service Restaurant. This includes an Initial Franchise Fee of \$40,000 and payments for initial inventory totaling approximately \$3,000 to \$5,000 for a Limited-Service Restaurant, and \$10,000 to \$20,000 for a Full-Service Restaurant, that must be paid to Franchisor or its affiliates.

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the Franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don’t rely on the Disclosure Document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contracts carefully. Show your contracts and this Disclosure Document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

Buying a franchise is a complex investment. The information in this Disclosure Document can help you make up your mind. More information on franchising, such as “A Consumer’s Guide to Buying a Franchise,” which can help you understand how to use this Disclosure Document, is available from the Federal Trade Commission. Please consider the following RISK FACTORS before you buy this franchise:

1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT PERMITS THE FRANCHISEE TO ARBITRATE OR LITIGATE WITH THE FRANCHISOR ONLY IN ILLINOIS. OUT-OF-STATE ARBITRATION OR LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO ARBITRATE OR LITIGATE WITH US IN ILLINOIS THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.

2. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.

We may use the services of one or more FRANCHISE BROKERS or referral sources to assist us in selling our franchise. A franchise broker or referral source represents us, not you. We pay this person a fee for selling our franchise or referring you to us. You should be sure to do your own investigation of the franchise.
