As a franchisee, you will operate a store offering tea, coffee and juice, along with related products and services under the name "Gong Cha"

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Gong Cha franchise is from \$222,200 to \$452,500. This includes \$40,700 to \$48,000 that must be paid to us as the franchisor. Please see Items 5 and 7 for additional details.

We may offer to enter into an area development agreement to establish and operate a certain number of Gong Cha franchises at specific locations pursuant to individual franchise agreements. The area development fee will be equal to \$15,000 multiplied by the number of Gong Cha franchises to be developed under the area development agreement. The area development fee will then be credited, in increments of \$15,000, toward the franchise fee owed for each Gong Cha franchise developed. Your estimated initial investment will vary based on the number of Stores to be developed.

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive the Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document**
