



FRANCHISE DISCLOSURE DOCUMENT

HIGH TOUCH INVESTMENT CORP.

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The franchise offered is for the operation of an outreach program under the name “High Touch-High Tech” which offers science educational programs to bring hands-on, participatory science experiences to classrooms and homes, as well as providing after school programs, holiday mini camp programs, summer programs, preschool programs and birthday parties.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a High Touch-High Tech franchised business is \$59,875 to \$63,600. This includes between \$52,900 to \$52,950 that must be paid to the franchisor and/or its affiliate, as appropriate.

We are offering to certain qualified people the right to become a Development Agent. A Development Agent must pay a Development Agent Rights fee of \$50,000 for a specific area. A Development Agent must own and operate one “High Touch-High Tech” franchise, for which it will pay us the initial franchise fee and any continuing fees.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive the disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don’t rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

OUT OF STATE ARBITRATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST MORE TO ARBITRATE WITH US IN NORTH CAROLINA THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.
2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND DEVELOPMENT AGENT AGREEMENT STATE THAT NORTH CAROLINA LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
