As a franchisee, you will operate a non-medical home care business that provides in-home companionship services under the name "Home Care Assistance 1-866-4-LiveIn®."

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a single HCA Business is from \$90110,250 to \$205245,250; between \$4666,250 and \$76117,250 of that must be paid to the franchisor. If you purchase The total investment necessary to begin operation of an HCA Area Development Agreement, youbusiness is between \$120,250 to \$265,250. This includes between \$76,250 and \$137,250 that must also paybe paid to the franchisor a development fee of \$10,000 per franchise in the Development Area or its affiliates.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.
