Franchisees will install Breath Alcohol Ignition Interlock Devices (B.A.I.I.D.'s) into vehicles, preventing operation if the driver's breath alcohol content exceeds the .030% level allowed. These Devices will need to be periodically inspected, calibrated and extracted by Franchisees, as required by the courts and/or California Department of Motor Vehicles.

The initial franchise fee is based upon \$10 00 per conviction as published by the Department of Motor Vehicle's DUI Management Information System Report to the Legislature, averaged over the past three reporting years. Franchisees must own the necessary tools, equipment and machinery to install, inspect, calibrate and extract each B.A.I.I.D. system. Franchisees must also own the necessary tools, equipment and machinery for off-site mobile installations, maintenance and calibration of the B.A.I.I.D. systems.

The total estimated initial investment necessary to begin operation of an Ignition Interlock Service Centers of California franchise ranges from \$2,500.00 (minimum franchise fee for less populated areas) to in excess of \$28,500.00. This sum does not include rent for the Franchisee's business location, or tools, equipment and machinery as mentioned above.

The disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read your entire contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

Buying a franchise is a complex investment. The information in this disclosure document can help you make up your mind.
