LeTip World Franchise, LLC, LLC offers franchises to franchisees who will establish and administer a regional business leads networking group.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a LeTip franchise ranges from \$48,110 to \$65,400. This includes \$43,500 to \$44,500 that must be paid to us and our affiliates.

If you purchase area development rights, the total investment necessary to begin operation of a LeTip franchise ranges from \$41,810 to \$59,100, plus a development fee equal to 50% of the total initial franchise fees that you must pay for your second and subsequent franchises established under the area development agreement (*i.e.*, \$18,000 per additional franchise). This includes \$43,500 to \$44,500 that must be paid to us and our affiliates plus the applicable development fee, which must also be paid to us.

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement, area development agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.
