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The franchisee will operate a business that provides supervised team cleaning services to homes and offers proprietary and other household products for sale using the trade name "MAID BRIGADE®."

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Maid Brigade franchise business is between \$85,000 and \$124,000. This includes between \$28,000 and \$45,000 that must be paid to the franchisor and its affiliates.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provision of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale.
