We offer Maui Wowi[®] franchises. As a franchisee, you will operate a restaurant called Maui Wowi, preparing and serving fresh fruit smoothies, Hawaiian coffee and related espresso beverages, a variety of Hawaiian products, and other beverage and food items, and other products and services. Maui Wowi products are sold from either fixed store fronts, non-traditional locations such as malls, airports or business complexes, or from portable units placed at events that occur on a periodic basis or are held in special or temporary venues. Three types of Maui Wowi franchises are being offered under this Franchise Disclosure Document. A "Single Unit Franchise" enables you to own and operate one Operating Unit. A "Standard Franchise" enables you to own and operate three (3) Operating Units, of any type in any combination. An "Empire Builder Franchise" enables you to own and operate ten (10) Operating Units of any type in any combination.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Maui Wowi franchise for a Single Unit Franchise ranges from \$73,900 to \$192,250 for a Mobile Operating Unit operating at Events, \$72,900 to \$220,050 for a Mobile Operating Unit operating at a Permanent Site, and \$84,850 to \$534,000 for a Fixed Operating Unit. The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Maui Wowi franchise for a Standard Franchise ranges from \$86,400 to \$487,750 for Mobile Operating Units operating at Events, \$85,400 to \$575,550 for Mobile Operating Units operating at Permanent Sites, and \$97,350 to \$1,492,500 for Fixed Operating Units. The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Maui Wowi franchise for an Empire ,Builder Franchise ranges from \$103,900 to \$1,500,750 for Mobile Operating Units operating at Events, \$107,900 to \$1,798,550 for Mobile Operating Units operating at Permanent Sites, and \$119,850 to \$4,910,000 for Fixed Operating Units.
