As a franchisee, you will operate a business specializing in a full-service, casual, family-oriented restaurant facility featuring Filipino-style cuisine.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of one Flagship Format MAX'S RESTAURANT CUISINE OF THE PHILIPPINES® ranges from \$822,000 to \$1,770,000, which includes \$50,000 that must be paid to the franchisor. The total investment necessary to begin operation of your first Flagship Format MAX'S RESTAURANT CUISINE OF THE PHILIPPINES® under an Area Development Agreement ranges from \$822,000 to \$1,770,000, which includes \$150,000 that must be paid to the franchisor. For franchisees with one Flagship Format MAX'S RESTAURANT CUISINE OF THE PHILIPPINES® in operation or development, the total investment necessary to begin operation of one Fast Casual Format MAX'S RESTAURANT CUISINE OF THE PHILIPPINES® ranges from \$372,200 to \$754,000, which includes \$25,000 that must be paid to the franchisor. The total investment necessary to begin operation of your first Fast Casual Format MAX'S RESTAURANT CUISINE OF THE PHILIPPINES® under an Area Development Agreement ranges from \$472,200 to \$879,000, which includes \$125,000 that must be paid to the franchisor. - 1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND AREA DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT REQUIRE YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY ARBITRATION ONLY IN COLORADO EXCEPT FOR CERTAIN DISPUTES, WHICH MUST BE LITIGATED IN COLORADO. OUT OF STATE ARBITRATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO ARBITRATE WITH US IN COLORADO THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.
- 2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND AREA DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT REQUIRE THAT COLORADO LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
- 3. THE PRIMARY TRADEMARK THAT YOU WILL USE IN YOUR BUSINESS IS NOT FEDERALLY REGISTERED. IF THE FRANCHISOR'S RIGHT TO USE THIS TRADEMARK IN YOUR AREA IS CHALLENGED, YOU MAY HAVE TO IDENTIFY YOUR BUSINESS AND PRODUCTS OR SERVICES WITH A NAME THAT DIFFERS FROM THAT USED BY OTHER FRANCHISEES AND FRANCHISOR. THIS CHANGE CAN BE EXPENSIVE AND MAY REDUCE BRAND RECOGNITION OF THE PRODUCTS OR SERVICES YOU OFFER.
