You will operate a retail store that offers fruit and vegetable juices, smoothies, specialty drinks, cleanses, acai bowls, and other health-centric snacks and related items in a contemporary environment under the NEKTAR JUICE BAR® trademarks

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a NEKTAR JUICE BAR® franchise is approximately \$225,250 to \$494,100. This includes the \$35,000 to \$62,500 that must be paid to us or our affiliates. The \$62,500 includes a development fee commitment to develop three Stores. If you are acquiring development rights under our area development program, then you will sign our Area Development Agreement and commit to the development of at least three Stores. Upon signing, you will pay us a development fee equal to 100% of the Initial Franchise Fee due for the first Store and 50% of the Initial Franchise Fee for each additional Store that you commit to develop.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**
