We are Obeo Franchising, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company. We offer franchises to qualified individuals and entities to own and operate an Obeo® franchise under our service marks, trade names, programs, and systems under the names. Our franchisees offer and provide quality real estate marketing programs, products, and services to the public under our Obeo® names and marks and the Obeo® programs and systems (the "Method of Operation").

The total investment necessary to begin operation of an Obeo® franchise is **\$22,950** to **\$280,400**. This estimate is only approximate. This includes **\$11,000** to **\$201,500** that must be paid to us or our affiliate.
