The franchise offered is a air conditioning and heating maintenance, repair and equipment replacement services franchised business.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a One Hour conversion franchised business is \$81,805 to \$252,012. This includes \$45,120 to \$50,515 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliates. It does not include fees for a territory with a population of greater than the minimum 100,000, for which we charge an additional \$430 for each 1,000 of population above 100,000. The total investment necessary to begin operation of a One Hour start-up franchised business is \$269,805 to \$550,862. This includes \$45,120 to \$47,115 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliates. It does not include fees for a territory with a population of greater than the minimum 100,000, for which we charge an additional \$430 for each 1,000 of population above 100,000.

If you sign an area development agreement to develop more than one air conditioning and heating maintenance, repair and equipment replacement services franchised business pursuant to a development schedule, you must also pay an area development fee equal to (a) \$10,000 multiplied by (b) the number of air conditioning and heating maintenance, repair and equipment replacement services franchised businesses to be developed under the area development agreement.

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

BEFORE YOU BUY, CONSIDER WHAT RIGHTS YOU HAVE TO RENEW YOUR FRANCHISE, IF ANY, AND WHAT TERMS YOU MIGHT HAVE TO ACCEPT IN ORDER TO RENEW.

Please consider the following RISK FACTORS before you buy this franchise:

- I. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND AREA DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT REQUIRE YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY LITIGATION OR, IN CERTAIN SITUATIONS, MEDIATION ONLY IN THE STATE WHERE OUR PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS IS LOCATED, CURRENTLY HOUSTON, TEXAS. OUT OF STATE LITIGATION OR MEDIATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO LITIGATE OR MEDIATE WITH US IN TEXAS OR ANOTHER STATE WHERE OUR PRINCIPAL PLACE OF BUSINESS MAY BE LOCATED IN THE FUTURE THAN IN YOUR OWN HOME STATE.
- 2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND AREA DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT EACH STATE THAT THE LAW OF THE STATE OF TEXAS GOVERNS THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND AREA DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTION AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
- 3. YOU MUST MAKE MINIMUM ROYALTY OR ADVERTISING FUND PAYMENTS REGARDLESS OF YOUR SALES LEVELS. YOUR INABILITY TO MAKE THE PAYMENTS MAY RESULT IN TERMINATION OF YOUR FRANCHISE AND LOSS OF YOUR INVESTMENT.
- 4. YOU MUST MAINTAIN MINIMUM SALES PERFORMANCE LEVELS. YOUR INABILITY TO MAINTAIN THESE LEVELS MAY RESULT IN LOSS OF ANY TERRITORIAL RIGHTS YOU ARE GRANTED, TERMINATION OF YOUR FRANCHISE AND LOSS OF YOUR INVESTMENT.
- 5. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.

We may use the services of one or more FRANCHISE BROKERS or referral sources to assist us in selling our franchise. A franchise broker or referral source represents us, not you. We pay this person a fee for selling our franchise or referring you to us. You should be sure to do your own investigation of the franchise.

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
