- 1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT REQUIRES YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY ARBITRATION/LITIGATION ONLY IN NEW MEXICO. OUT-OF-STATE ARBITRATION/LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO ARBITRATE/LITIGATE WITH US IN NEW MEXICO THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.

- 3. THE FRANCHISOR RESERVES THE RIGHT TO ESTABLISH MINIMUM AND MAXIMUM RESALE PRICES FOR MARKETING AND SPECIAL PRICE PROMOTIONS.
- 4. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.
