As of the date of this Offering Circular, the total investment necessary to begin operation of a PreEminent franchise is \$29,000 to \$97,500. This includes the \$1,000 franchise fee that must be paid to the franchisor. Items 5 through 7 of this Offering Circular should be consulted for further detail.

At this time, we do not have direct access to your computer or an ability to access data an sales and other information maintained by your system, but we reserve this right. Also, we have the right to inspect any aspect of your business, including information and data on your computer whenever we want. There is no limit on our right to access this information. All email accounts issued by us are considered our property. All emails sent and received through our email accounts may be monitored at any time by us without notice to you or your employees. See §3.15

We have the right to inspect your books records data and financial statements, which would include accessing the software programs used to compile this information. There is no contractual limit on our right to access this information. §3.15

Updating Requirements for Computer System

As do all computer owners, you must pay all costs incurred to repair broken components or non-functioning software and to upgrade your system with new software or hardware. We may require you to upgrade or update your computer system during the term of the franchise, especially if you are running outdated versions of software, operating systems or browsers. There is not limit on how often we can ask you to do this. If we feel there are significant updating or upgrading requirements, these will be specified in our Operations Manual and you will be required to follow these. There is no contractual limit on the frequency or cost of this updating process, but it is usually a nominal expense, probably less than \$500 to \$1,000 per year. Unless you make independent arrangements directly with hardware and software providers they typically have no ongoing maintenance or repair responsibilities. §3.15
