You will operate a quick-service restaurant specializing in the sale of fried chicken, seafood and other quick service food under the name "Popeyes Louisiana Kitchen" ("Restaurant").

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Popeyes Louisiana Kitchen franchised business is between \$363,300375,800 to \$443520,100 for a new free-standing facility, between \$285297;300 to \$423454,100 for a new in-line facility, and between \$235247,300 to \$454466,100 for a converted facility, excluding real estate and improvements. This includes a franchise fee for each Restaurant of \$35,000 and development fee of \$12,500 for each Restaurant you agree to develop under the development agreement that must be paid to us.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, us or our affiliate in connection with the proposed sale. Note, however that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

- 2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT STATES THAT GEORGIA LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
