The franchise offered is for a restaurant offering breakfast, lunch and dinner menus, including breakfast items, soups, salads, wraps, burgers, sandwiches, pasta, smoothies and other beverages under the name "Rachel's Kitchen" or "Little Rachel's Kitchen". A Rachel's Kitchen restaurant operates using the franchisor's proprietary recipes, formulae, techniques, trade dress, trademarks and logos.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Rachel's Kitchen franchise is \$250,450 to \$522,880. This includes between \$46,500 and \$52,000 that must be paid to the franchisor and/or its affiliate, as appropriate.

If you enter into an Area Development Agreement, you must commit to develop between three and ten restaurants. When you sign the Area Development Agreement you will pay to us the initial franchise fee for the first Restaurant to be developed plus the reduced initial franchise fee for the second restaurant and each additional restaurant you commit to develop. The total estimated investment under an Area Development Agreement to develop three Rachel's Kitchen Restaurants is \$302,450 to \$575,380. This includes \$96,500 to \$102,000 that must be paid to the franchisor and/or its affiliate. The total investment under an Area Development Agreement will vary depending on the number of restaurants to be developed.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive the disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

Buying a franchise is a complex investment. The information in this disclosure document can help you make up your mind.
