This Disclosure Document is for existing RE-BATH franchised businesses, who are operating their business under an agreement that commenced prior to December 1, 2012, that have chosen to renew the RE-BATH franchise. This Disclosure Document will not be extended to any person or entity that is not currently operating a RE-BATH under a franchise agreement that commenced on or before December 1, 2012 (the “**Former Agreement**”).

As a RE-BATH franchisee, you will provide bathroom remodeling services, including the marketing, sale, design and installation of custom manufactured bathtub and shower base liners, replacement bathtubs and shower bases, walk-in bathtubs, wall panels, vanity cabinets, vanity tops, toilets, flooring and ancillary products such as shower doors, lighting, valves, plumbing fixtures, and installation tools, products and supplies.

The total investment necessary to renew your RE-BATH franchise ranges from \$1,000 to \$5,000 that must be paid to the franchisor for the renewal of the RE-BATH franchise.

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the Disclosure Document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this Disclosure Document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

Buying a franchise is a complex investment. The information in this Disclosure Document can help you make up your mind. YOU MAY HAVE TO SIGN A NEW AGREEMENT WITH DIFFERENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS IN ORDER TO CONTINUE TO OPERATE YOUR BUSINESS. BEFORE YOU BUY, CONSIDER WHAT RIGHTS YOU HAVE TO RENEW YOUR FRANCHISE, IF ANY, AND WHAT TERMS YOU MIGHT HAVE TO ACCEPT IN ORDER TO RENEW.

Please consider the following RISK FACTORS before you buy this franchise:

1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT REQUIRES YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY ARBITRATION, MEDIATION OR LITIGATION ONLY IN ARIZONA. OUT-OF-STATE ARBITRATION, MEDIATION OR LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO ARBITRATE, MEDIATE OR LITIGATE WITH US IN ARIZONA THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.
2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT STATES THAT ARIZONA LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
3. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.

A franchise broker or referral source is our agent and represents us, not you. We pay this person a fee for selling our franchise or referring you to us.
