The franchisee will operate a Right at Home business that provides hands-on personal care, non-medical care, in-home care assistance and companionship care services to seniors and others, and (i) supplemental staffing services for nursing homes, hospitals and other medical institutional settings; (ii) skilled nursing and other in-home medical care; and (iii) other related products, materials, and equipment.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Right a Home franchise ranges from \$72,200 to \$126,100 (the total amount of Item 7). This includes \$42,500 that must be paid to the franchisor. Effective April 13, 2013, the amount that must be paid to the franchisor will increase to \$45,000.

If you sign a Multiple Unit Development Agreement, you will pay the then-current Initial Franchise Fee for the first Franchised Business plus 75% of the then-current Initial Franchise Fee for each additional Franchised Business that you intend to develop under the terms of the Multiple Unit Development Agreement.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least fourteen (14) calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this disclosure document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

Buying a franchise is a complex investment. The information in this disclosure document can help you make up your mind. More information on franchising, such as "*A Consumer's Guide to Buying a Franchise*", which can help you understand how to use this disclosure document, is available from the Federal Trade Commission.
