We are offering a franchise for a retail store operating under the "Rent-n-Roll" and "ANR Custom Wheels & Tires" names that sell and rent wheels, tires and other automotive accessories.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a new 9NR Custom Wheels & Tires Store is \$324,000 to \$809,300. This includes \$37,500 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliate.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Multi –Unit for ANR Custom Wheels & Tires is \$364,000 to \$849,300. This includes \$75,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliate

We may also offer a multi-unit development agreement to an individual or company that agrees to develop at least three <code>RNR</code> Custom Wheels & Tires stores in a specific geographic area. A multi-unit developer will pay a development fee that is equal to 100% of the initial franchise fee for the first store to be developed, plus a deposit equal to 50% of the reduced initial franchise fee for each additional store that will be developed. We will apply a pro rata portion of the development fee toward the initial franchise fee due for each store, and the balance of the reduced initial franchise fee is payable by you when you sign the Franchise Agreement for each store. The total investment necessary under the multi-unit development agreement will vary depending on the number of stores to be developed.

This Disclosure Document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this Disclosure Document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this Disclosure Document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

BEFORE YOU BUY, CONSIDER WHAT RIGHTS YOU HAVE TO RENEW YOUR FRANCHISE, IF ANY, AND WHAT TERMS YOU MIGHT HAVE TO ACCEPT IN ORDER TO RENEW.

Please consider the following RISK FACTORS before you buy this franchise:

- 1. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND MULTI-UNIT DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT REQUIRE YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY MEDIATION AND ARBITRATION ONLY IN FLORIDA. OUT OF STATE MEDIATION AND ARBITRATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO MEDIATE OR ARBITRATE WITH US IN FLORIDA THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.
- 2. THE FRANCHISE AGREEMENT AND MULTI-UNIT DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT STATE THAT FLORIDA LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENTS, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
  - 3. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.
