We are **Shilo Inns, Franchise, LLC**, an Oregon limited liability company. We offer franchises to qualified individuals and entities to own and operate specialized lodging and hospitality facilities under the "**Shilo**" anames, logos, and Service Marks. Our franchisees use our Shilo systems and programs, and other systems, procedures, methods, and operating requirements (the "Method of Operation").

We anticipate the total investment necessary to begin operation of a new Shilo property, including development, construction, furnishings, fixtures, inventory, and working capital is approximately \$7,366,500 to \$203,340,000 (plus the cost or acquiring or leasing land, see notes to Item 7 for details).

We anticipate the total investment necessary to convert an existing property to the Shilo system and to begin operation is approximately **\$1,699,500** to **\$58,845,000** (plus improvements, furnishings, fixtures, equipment, insurance, employees, telephone service and utilities, see notes to Item 7 for details).

The total investment necessary for a franchise related to the purchase of a Company/Affiliate owned Shilo property is variable and depends upon a number of factors, but is less than the operation of a newly constructed or converted property and is estimated to be approximately \$20,500 to \$2,205,000 (plus any additional insurance, signage, furniture, fixtures, equipment, employees, telephone service and utilities, and stationary and promotional materials, see notes to Item 7 for details)

You bear all costs to establish, develop, construct or convert and to operate your Shilo property. See Item 7 (Initial Investment) for more detailed information. The total investment estimates include the Initial Franchise Fee that must be paid to us:

The Initial Franchise Fee for a new or converted property is the greater of \$50,000 or \$500 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn Suites Hotel, the greater of \$45,000 or \$450 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn Hotel, the greater of \$35,000 or \$350 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn Suites, and the greater of \$25,000 or \$300 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn. The Initial Franchise Fee for an existing Shilo that is purchased by you from a Company/Affiliate, is the greater of \$25,000 or \$250 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn Suites Hotel, the greater of \$22,500 or \$225 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn Hotel, the greater of \$17,500 or \$175 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn Suites, and the greater of \$12,500 or \$150 per lodging room for a Shilo Inn.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.
