As an Area Representative, you will solicit potential purchasers for our restaurant franchises and provide development and ongoing franchise support services to multi-unit franchises in your defined territory. Each franchisee of a "Black Rock Bar & Grill" franchise will license directly from us the right to operate a full-service restaurant and bar offering Australian-style rock cooking where certain menu items are cooked on a hot volcanic rock at the customer's table, as well as a diverse menu offering steaks, seafood, pasta, burgers, soup, salads and beverages (including alcoholic beverages).

The total investment necessary to begin operation of an area representative franchise \$267,650 to \$344,950. This includes \$250,000 that must be paid to the franchisor. As an area representative, you must own and operate at least one Black Rock Bar & Grill Restaurant.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive the disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

- 1. THE AREA REPRESENTATIVE AGREEMENT REQUIRES YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US BY MEDIATION AND ARBITRATION ONLY IN MICHIGAN. OUT-OF-STATE MEDIATION AND ARBITRATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST YOU MORE TO MEDIATE AND ARBITRATE WITH US IN MICHIGAN THAN IN YOUR OWN STATE.
- 2. THE AREA REPRESENTATIVE AGREEMENT STATES THAT MICHIGAN LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENT, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.
- 3. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THIS FRANCHISE.

We use the services of one or more FRANCHISE BROKERS or referral sources to assist us in selling our franchise. A franchise broker or referral source represents us, not you. We pay this person a fee for selling our franchise or referring you to us. You should be sure to do your own investigation of the franchise.
