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Smile Source franchisees operate a dental office, in a specific territory, for routine dental treatments, conducting examinations to diagnose extensive implant, cosmetic and orthodontic elective health problems, using corrective tooth loss and esthetic measures such as dental prosthetic implant replacements or orthodontic and cosmetic corrections, and all other areas of dental care which dentists may be permitted by law to perform, including the retail sale of dental supplies

There is no initial franchise fee. The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Smile Source franchise is \$60,500 to \$435,000 if you open a new office and \$27,800 to \$86,200 if you convert an existing office. None of this amount is paid to the franchisor or any affiliate.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

The terms of your contract will govern your franchise relationship. Don't rely on the disclosure document alone to understand your contract. Read all of your contract carefully. Show your contract and this disclosure document to an advisor, like a lawyer or an accountant.

Buying a franchise is a complex investment. The information in this disclosure document can help you make up your mind.
