Our showrooms are interactive fun centers specially designed to encourage exercise, imaginative play and social development. Our centers offer open play sessions as well as parties.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Superior Play Systems franchise ranges from \$266,170 to \$318,345. This includes \$40,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliate.
