The franchise is a quick service unit featuring soft serve ice cream products, although the menu may include hamburgers, hot dogs, french fries and drinks. The total initial investment necessary to begin operation of a Tastee-Freez restaurant/store franchise ranges from \$69,100 to \$1,288,300. This normally includes a \$10,000 franchise fee for a franchise featuring soft serve ice cream products only or a \$20,000 franchise fee for a franchise featuring soft serve ice cream products and food and drink products, that must be paid to the franchisor, but until April ___, 2015, the \$10,000 franchise fee is reduced by 50% to \$5,000 and the \$20,000 franchise fee is reduced by 50% to \$10,000

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document**.
