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The franchise offered is for a fast casual restaurant operating under the name "The Original WOW! Burger" A 'The Original WOW! Burger" restaurant offers all-natural and hormone free beef, chicken and turkey burgers with buns baked fresh daily, an array of toppings and beer and wine in a high energy environment A The Original WOW! Burger restaurant offers lunch and dinner menus for dine-in, take-out and catering and operates using the franchisor's proprietary recipes, formulae, techniques, trade dress, trademarks and logos

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a 'The Original WOW! Burger" franchised business is \$430,133 to \$594,967 This includes between \$35,000 and \$51,500 that must be paid to the franchisor and/or its affiliate

If you enter into a Multi-Unit Operator Agreement to develop at least three Restaurants, when you sign the Multi-Unit Operator Agreement you will pay a reservation fee equal to \$13,750 for each Restaurant to be developed under the Multi-Unit Operator Agreement. The total investment under a Multi-Unit Operator Agreement will vary depending on the number of Restaurants to be developed.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive the disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale.
