The franchise is for the establishment and operation of a day spa business which provides massage therapy, facials, pedicures, manicures, and body treatments and offers and sells various lines of retail products ("Woodhouse Day Spa" or "Spa").

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a Woodhouse Spa is between \$499,050497,550 and \$658,400.692,400. This includes \$74,20076,200 that must be paid to the franchisor or affiliate. If you sign, a Development Agreement, you also pay a development fee equal to \$48,000 for the first Spa to be developed plus 50% of the initial franchise fee for each additional Spa to be developed. The <u>pro rata</u> portion of the development fee allocable to each Spa will be credited against the initial franchise fee due for that Spa.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your Franchise Agreement and Development Agreement, and any other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. Note, however, that no governmental agency has verified the information contained in this document.

THE FRANCHISE AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENTS REQUIRE YOU TO MEDIATE ONLY IN VICTORIA, TEXAS AND SUE US ONLY IN VICTORIA COUNTY, TEXAS OR IN THE FEDERAL DISTRICT COURT FOR THE SOUTHERN DISTRICT OF TEXAS. OUT OF STATE MEDIATION AND LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST MORE TO MEDIATE IN VICTORIA, TEXAS AND LITIGATE WITH US IN TEXAS THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.

2. THE FRANCHISE AND DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENTS REQUIRE THAT TEXAS LAW GOVERNS THE AGREEMENTS, AND THIS LAW MAY NOT PROVIDE THE SAME PROTECTIONS AND BENEFITS AS LOCAL LAW. YOU MAY WANT TO COMPARE THESE LAWS.

OUR DECEMBER 31, 2013 AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS SHOW THAT WE 3. We use the services of one or more Franchise Brokers or referral sources (which may include area representatives or regional developers) to assist us in selling our franchise. A franchise broker or referral source represents us, not you. We pay this person a fee for selling our franchise or referring you to us. You should be sure to do your own investigation of the franchise.
