You will operate either (1) an ACRUX™ temporary employment service business specializing in primarily skilled, semi-skilled and unskilled industrial personnel, as well as clerical and secretarial personnel; or (2) a TROJAN LABOR™ temporary employment service business specializing in primarily unskilled industrial and construction personnel.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of an ACRUX or TROJAN LABOR franchised business is \$45,150 to \$144,750. This includes \$3,500 to \$26,000 that must be paid to the franchisor or its affiliate(s).

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale. **Note, however, that no government agency has verified the information contained in this document.**

2. THE FRANCHISEE AGREEMENT REQUIRES YOU TO RESOLVE DISPUTES WITH US ONLY IN SOUTH CAROLINA. ALL DISPUTES MUST BE SUBMITTED TO MEDIATION IN SOUTH CAROLINA BEFORE ANY LAW SUIT IS FILED. OUT OF STATE MEDIATION OR LITIGATION MAY FORCE YOU TO ACCEPT A LESS FAVORABLE SETTLEMENT FOR DISPUTES. IT MAY ALSO COST MORE TO MEDIATE OR LITIGATE WITH HIRE QUEST, L.L.C. IN SOUTH CAROLINA THAN IN YOUR HOME STATE.
3. YOU MUST MAINTAIN MINIMUM SALES PERFORMANCE LEVELS. IF YOU FAIL TO DO SO, YOU COULD LOSE YOUR EXCLUSIVE TERRITORY OR THE FRANCHISOR COULD TERMINATE YOUR AGREEMENT AND YOU COULD LOSE YOUR INVESTMENT.
4. THERE MAY BE OTHER RISKS CONCERNING THE FRANCHISE.

We may use the services of one or more FRANCHISE BROKERS or referral sources to assist us in selling our franchise. A franchise broker or referral source represents us, not you.
