We offer franchises for rental stores operated under the True Value Rental brand that primarily rent tools, party supplies, machines and other products.

The total investment necessary to begin operation of a True Value Rental rental store franchise is \$541,850541,600 to \$997,050 for a new franchise and \$50,80050,550 to \$607,050 for a conversion franchise. This includes between \$409,800409,550 and \$737,550 that must be paid to us or an affiliate if it is a new franchise and \$9,8009,550 to \$437,550 if it is a conversion franchise.

This disclosure document summarizes certain provisions of your franchise agreement and other information in plain English. Read this disclosure document and all accompanying agreements carefully. You must receive this disclosure document at least 14 calendar-days before you sign a binding agreement with, or make any payment to, the franchisor or an affiliate in connection with the proposed franchise sale.
